Online classes, assignments, and student support were conducted through WhatsApp groups, google meet and recorded notes.

In this Covid period, the practicum for 4th semester students was conducted in blended mode. Initially classes and practicum discussions were held online due to restrictions and network challenges. When offline sessions were later permitted, the college followed the SOP strictly by allowing only 50% attendance I rotation. To ensure safety and effective training this 50% group was further divided into smaller batches under different teachers. Through this systematic division and careful planning student teachers were able to complete lesson planning, simulated teaching, and practicum activities safely and effectively.

Awareness Program on Air Pollution

An Awareness programme on Air Pollution was organized on 10th Nov 2021 by the B.Ed. Trainees at kombo village. The main objective of the programme was to educate students and community about the causes, effects and preventive measures related to air pollution.

Faculty members and trainees highlighted the harmful impacts of smoke, vehicle emissions , and burning of plastics on human health and environment. The trainees also presented posters and slogans to spread the mssage of maintaining clean air and adopting ecofriendly habits such as planting trees and avoiding waste burning.

Workshop cum training program on priesthood:

During the academic year, Teachers Training College B.Ed., Aalo organized a **Workshop-cum-Training Programme on Priesthood** with the objective of preserving, documenting, and promoting the rich indigenous cultural heritage of the region. The programme brought together **local priest experts, trainee teachers, and faculty members** for an immersive learning experience. Resource persons elaborated on the **traditional priestly practices, ceremonial procedures, ritual chants, and ethical responsibilities** associated with priesthood among the Galo community. Participants gained insights into the **symbolic meanings, oral traditions, and socio-cultural relevance** of various rituals performed during festivals, marriages, agricultural activities, and community events. The hands-on demonstrations enabled trainee teachers to appreciate the scientific, historical, and anthropological dimensions of indigenous knowledge systems. The workshop enhanced cultural sensitivity among trainees and strengthened their ability to integrate **local knowledge and values into school pedagogy**, aligning with the vision of NEP 2020 on cultural rootedness.

The APPEIRC team visited the college in 21st April 2022 as part of their institutional inspection and academic strengthening process. The visiting officials interacted with faculty, staff and reviewed academic records, teaching learning practices, and practicum files.
